DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

This notice explains how we use your information and the rights you have in relation to your personal information.

We will hold:

- Data to identify you, including your name, address and year of birth
- Details of your income, outgoings, debts and assets
- Brief details of your health, if relevant to the application
- Information on your marital status
- Details of your dependents
- Information about you provided by others in support of your application for assistance, e.g. social workers, doctors and other third parties.

We use your information to assess and process your application for assistance, and not for any other reason. Where possible data which are no longer relevant are redacted.

We will hold your data only for such period as is necessary (as a general rule for not more than seven years).

You have the right to:

- Access your information and receive copies of your information
- Have inaccurate/incomplete information corrected and updated
- In certain circumstances if applicable, have your information deleted or our use of your data restricted
- Exercise the right to data portability if applicable (i.e. obtain a transferable version of your information to transfer to another provider)
- Withdraw consent at any time where processing is based on consent and if practicable.
